


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SYNOPSIS

Having lost her mother less than a year ago, MARIANNA, a biracial woman, comes home for her DAD's birthday. This is Dad's first birthday since the passing of MOM, who is Indonesian but ethnically Chinese. It is a hard time for Dad who longs for his wife's tradition of preparing instant noodles for birthdays. Although strange to some, in Chinese culture, the consumption of noodles symbolizes longevity. While struggling with grief, regret, and her inner conflict of embracing her Chinese Indonesian heritage, Marianna decides to forego the instant noodle for her Dad's birthday.





So, when her dad tells her that he would like to have the instant noodle for his birthday, Marianna is forced to go on a last-minute grocery run. Unfortunately, for Marianna, this tiny errand turns into a gargantuan task, when Marianna encounters a series of unfortunate events. Starting with her car breaking down, followed by her phone dying, and with her not enough cash to purchase the instant noodle.



Thankfully though, Marianna is not alone in this journey, because Mom is there to help, coming and going out of the story as a ghostly memory, a figment of Marianna's imagination. Along the way, Marianna meets people who help her on her journey. People like ANDREAS, the wise car mechanic, and AUDREY, a ten-year-old Indonesian girl, who helps Marianna find the instant noodle. Through these encounters, Marianna is forced to confront her struggles with her Indonesian heritage and her relationship with her mom.

At the end of her journey, Marianna is able to come to terms with her Indonesian heritage and properly grieve the loss of her mom to cancer by continuing her mom's tradition of making instant noodles for every birthday celebration.

DEVELOPMENT

Instant Noodle, was written in August 2020, about five months into the Covid-19 Pandemic, for a USC advanced screenwriting zoom class. The story was conceived when Michelle was feeling particularly home sick and confined to her apartment. One day Michelle decided that she wanted to eat her childhood favorite Instant Noodle brand, Indomie, only to discover that she had none left, It was a dissapointing chapter of the Pandemic, but it was the inspiration behind this story.

The story was fleshed out upon realizing that Michelle and her friends was rediscovering, their strong attachment to childhood comfort foods. These foods, regardless of cultural background, seemd have strong ties to family. The tragedies that unfortunately became all too common during the pandemic, emphasizes the importance of family and on how comfort foods can bring families together.

PRODUCTIONS

Most of the crew and cast of Instant Noodle, decided to join after learning about the story, thus a cast and crew of multinational and diverse team was formed.

Also, In order to stay authentic to the film, Michelle, Nidhi, and Jiayun reached out to multiple asian groceries, and was able to shoot their film in Medan Kitchen, an Indonesian market owned and operated by Indonesian Immigrants. We are thankful to have been able to receive the hlep of the tightly knit Indonesian immigrant community of Los Angeles.





POST PRODUCTION
